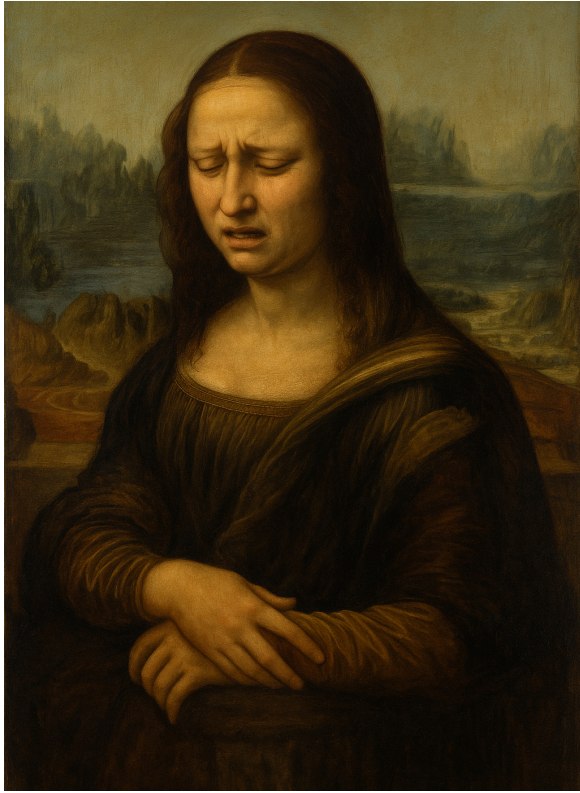

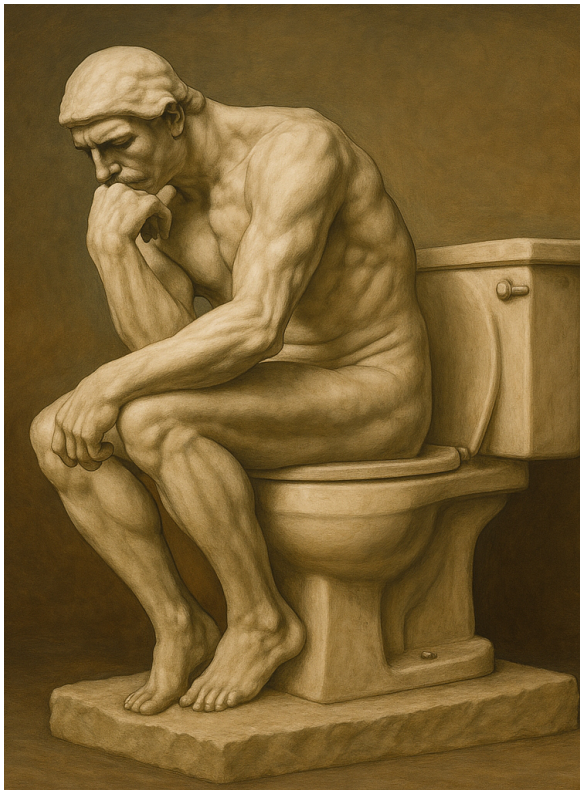
Each of the following paintings are forgeries by the infamous Lemongello da Cremona. Can you figure out what he named each piece? One set of names appears on the last page.
